

ALL MILITARY FAMILIES SHOULD HAVE ACCESS TO:

- * Safe and affordable childcare.
- ★ Quality **education**, seamless educational transitions during relocations, and equitable resources for special education and other essential services.
- ★ Quality healthcare, including mental health services for the whole family.
- ★ Safe and affordable housing.
- ★ Equitable and meaningful **employment** for every military-connected spouse.

THE STATISTICS



Over 80% of active duty families have difficulty finding childcare.1

Most military children will attend **6 to 9** different schools during their K through 12 **education**.²



More than **60%** of military families are burdened with paying more than they can comfortably afford for **housing**.³



Out of the 60%, **80%** reported monthly housing expenses not covered by their BAH were in excess of \$200 out-of-pocket/month.³

Almost **30%** of military families reported lack of **spouse employment** as a contributing factor to their financial stress.



Military spouse unemployment rates are more than $\bf 3x$ the national rate.³

Military spouses reported **childcare** being too expensive as the top reason they are not working.



Nearly **1 out of 4** active duty military families report they do not receive mental **healthcare**, but would like to.

44% indicated that finding an available provider was a reason they do not receive care.³

Although the order and degree of these five issues vary from installation to installation, they consistently rise to the top according to feedback from military families and surveys from multiple organizations. Note: Members of Exceptional Family Member Program (EFMP) are impacted in unique ways by each of the "Five & Thrive" QoL issues.

CHILD DEVELOPMENT CENTER (CDC): 940.676.2038

The Sheppard AFB CDC offers full day care for infants, pre-toddlers, preschoolers, and toddlers. Care must be requested online at MilitaryChildcare.com.

MADRIGAL YOUTH CENTER: 940.676.5437

The Madrigal Youth Center Program consists of Open Recreation, Sports, and the School Age Program. They provide care and activities for children in kindergarten through high school. School Age programs include Before School Care, After School Care, and Hourly Care. Care must be requested online at MilitaryChildcare.com.

FAMILY CHILD CARE PROGRAM (FCC): 940.676.5437

Family Childcare is regular care of a child in the home of another family. FCC providers can also offer free child care for extended duty, deployments and PCS.

NEW PARENT SUPPORT PROGRAM (NPSP): 940.676.2271

The New Parent Support Program (NPSP) is a free service designed to help expectant parents and families with children from birth to three years of age. The program is designed to assist parents with challenging and changing roles as mother, father, and family. It is a benefit you are entitled to receive. NPSP services are provided to enhance development of all family members, promote positive parent skills and to help maintain healthy families. Services are available for military members and eligible beneficiaries.

TEXAS HEALTH & HUMAN SERVICES: CHILD CARE

Search for a Licensed Child Care Center or a Licensed or Registered Child Care Home.

TEXAS RISING STAR

The Texas Rising Star program is a quality rating and improvement system (QRIS) for child care programs participating in the Texas Workforce Commission's (TWC) Child Care Services program. Texas Rising Star certification is available to licensed centers and licensed and registered child care home facilities that meet the certification criteria.

The Texas Rising Star program offers three <u>levels of quality certification</u> (Two-Star, Three-Star, and Four-Star) to encourage child care and early learning programs to attain progressively higher levels of quality. These certification levels are tied to graduated enhanced reimbursement rates for children receiving child care scholarships.

THE COMMONS

The Commons is home to community programs, <u>ITT</u> (Information, Tickets, & Travel) the <u>library</u>, the <u>engraving</u> shop and <u>Common Grounds</u> <u>Coffee Shop</u>. They also have an indoor playground and children's library! You can also renew your ID at the commons at the kiosk.

FITNESS CENTERS

Sheppard AFB is home to Pitsenbarger Fitness Center and Levitow Fitness Center. Both centers have a variety of cardio and strength equipment, aerobics rooms, basketball courts, racquetball courts, and lock room facilities. They also offer equipment rentals, orientations, personal training, and aerobics classes free of charge.

- The <u>Levitow Fitness Center</u> mainly serves the permanent party population, including active-duty military and their dependents, TDY, retirees, and Depart of Defense employees. The Levitow also offers 24-hour access for eligible cardholders, as well as a parentchild room for parents with children six and under.

 - Arrive & Thrive is the Heart Link here at Sheppard that provides information on things specific to Sheppard AFB. It's about 1½ hour brief and then an information fair so that you can speak one on one with agencies such as the Chamber of Commerce, the school liaison and the Chaplains, to name a few.

Bundles for Babies

• This monthly program is designed for soon to be and new parents, providing them with information about healthcare, childcare, financial readiness and local resources (WIC, lactation consultants, birthing options, etc.). All attendees also receive handmade items, and for those who qualify, they also receive a voucher from the Air Force Aid Society (AFAS).

• Hearts Apart

 This program provides events for families who have a member currently deployed, returned home in the past 30 days or preparing to go in the next 30 days. These events are provided at no cost to families. Please contact the Military & Family Readiness Center for upcoming events.

 The Military and Family Readiness Center has 6 certified counselors on staff to educate and assist military families with budgeting, debt consolidation, credit repair, car/house buying, investing and more!

• Key Support Liaisons (KSLs) are volunteers within your spouses' unit that are appointed by the Commander and serve as a resource for Air Force families, serving as a link between unit leadership and families and providing peer-to-peer support. The SAPR offices provides assistance, advocacy, support, and empowerment to those who have experienced sexual assault and harassment and to prevent sexual violence in our community through education and intervention.

SHEPPARD SPOUSES' CLUB

The Sheppard Spouses' Club is a non-profit organization established as a 501(c)4. They support military families through volunteerism, social engagements, and charitable contributions. The Spouses Club is a joint club that welcomes retiree, enlisted and officer spouses.

SHEPPARD THRIFT SHOP

Sheppard Thrift Shop is owned and operated by the Sheppard Spouses' Club. Proceeds from the Sheppard Thrift Shop are used to help the SSC award scholarships to military spouses and dependent children, give charitable grants to our community as well as support our military spouses through monthly activities. The Shop takes donations during open hours and consignments during specific hours with a 30/70 split. Stop in and ask for details. Volunteering at the Sheppard Thrift Shop is a great way to connect to the Sheppard community and other spouses!

The legal office offers walk-in services for notaries and powers of attorney. The drafting of wills and advice on personal civil legal matters are by appointment only. Legal professionals can advise on matters such as financial affairs; family law to include marriage or divorce; immigration; Service Members Civil Relief Act; and wills. Attorneys, however, cannot give advice on behalf of a third-party, criminal proceedings, or grievances made against the government or affiliates.

The <u>Air Force Base Legal Assistance</u> website is an additional resource for military members. This website is an invaluable resource with information on a multitude of common legal issues.

Additionally, the website allows members to fill out power of attorney worksheets in the convenience of their own home, which in turn speeds up their legal office visit. Just be sure to copy the 8-digit ticket number accurately so when you come in we can pull up your power of attorney worksheet.

The Texas Veterans Network (TVN) is a statewide collaborative of more than 250 veteran-serving community-based organizations and government agencies that holistically serve the veteran and military community. There are more than 1,100 resources for the military and veteran community. The TVN serves active duty, reservists, National Guard, veterans from all services and family members.
